Requirements for Participation

All participating residents must have this permit to enter the Public Works Compound during the Household Hazardous Waste collection period. This permit is valid for only one visit. Residents may bring a maximum of 15 gallons of Household Hazardous Waste and 15 gallons of Latex paint. Items that will be collected are: Oil based paint, Linseed Oil, Oil Based Stains, Turpentine, Varnish, Paint Remover, Paint Thinner, Liquid Mercury, Mercury Thermometers, Thermostats, Used Antifreeze, Used Motor Oil, Old Gasoline, Transmission Fluid, Brake Fluid, Chemical Fertilizers Rechargeable Batteries, Fluorescent Lamps. **Note: Residents may bring one computer, one monitor, one keyboard and one television to the collection.**

All household hazardous waste must be in its original container with labels attached. Secondary containers for all products must be clearly marked with contents and be in a securely closed container. Residents should place their containers in cardboard boxes and transport the containers in the trunks of vehicles or in pickup beds to the Public Works Department at 530 Maine Ave. Trained attendants will unload the product containers from your car or truck.
