What do I need to obtain a permit?

You will need proof of residence, and a **detailed list of the types of materials and <u>quantities</u>** you will be bringing to the collection.

What will be included in the Household Hazardous Waste Product collection?

Residents may bring a maximum of <u>10 gallons</u> of Household Hazardous Waste to the collection.

Linseed Oil Turpentine Varnish Chemical Fertilizer Paint – Oil Based & Latex (see below)* Pesticides Used Antifreeze Old Gasoline Brake Fluid Aerosol Cans Used Motor Oil Transmission Fluid Paint Remover and Thinner

*NOTICE: IMPORTANT

All latex and oil based paints will be accepted in any quantity at this event. All containers must have original labels. No drums or containers larger than 5 gallons will be accepted.

Items NOT Accepted:

Alkaline batteries – throw in the trash Explosives/ammunition Prescription Medicines/Syringes Biological waste Radioactive wastes

What should be done with Universal Waste?

<u>Brewer residents</u> can bring computers, monitors, keyboards, televisions, rechargeable batteries, mercury thermostats, liquid mercury and fluorescent lamps (i.e. Universal Waste) to this event. Residents can also bring Universal Waste to the Universal Waste Collection building at 37 Oak Street <u>on select Saturdays</u> every month for no fee. Who can participate in the Household Hazardous Waste Product Collection Program?

Brewer residents only.

Residents from Brewer must have a <u>Residential Household Hazardous Waste Product Permit</u> in order to participate in the collection. <u>The permit must be brought to the Brewer Public Works Dept. on Saturday, October</u> <u>6th</u> · Brewer residents, <u>must</u> obtain a permit at the Brewer Public Works Dept., 221 Green Point Road (989-7800) during normal business hours from <u>SEPTEMBER 10th through 3:00 PM, THURSDAY, OCTOBER 4th,</u> <u>2018.</u>

How do I properly dispose of Household Hazardous Products?

BRING PRODUCTS that say: Caution, Poison, Toxic, Flammable, Pesticide, Warning, Combustible, and/or Danger.

Secondary containers for all products must be clearly marked with contents and be in a securely closed container. Residents should place their containers in cardboard boxes and transport the containers in the trunks of vehicles or in pickup beds to the Brewer Public Works Dept. at 221 Green Point Road. Trained attendants will unload the product containers from your car or truck.

Why can we bring paint this year, when we couldn't in the past?

The City of Brewer is working with a government agency called Paint Care, who will accept and recycle all paint and primer (latex or oil based) for free.

Is there a charge?

If the resident does not pre-register for a Household Hazardous Collection Permit, <u>a FEE of \$6 per gallon will be</u> charged the day of the collection. (Cash or check only)

What are mercury rechargeable batteries?

These batteries are the types of batteries that power rechargeable toys and hand tools. They are also found in some small appliances such as hand-held vacuum cleaners. These batteries also include "Button Cells" that power wristwatches and laser pointers. This type of battery can be brought to the Hazardous Waste Collection day for proper disposal.

What do I do with car, lawnmower, and boat batteries?

These batteries <u>are not</u> part of the Household Hazardous Waste collection and <u>will not</u> be collected. You may consider returning them to the place that they were purchased or call One Steel at 947-3710. One Steel is presently accepting these types of batteries.

What do I do with propane gas tanks?

Propane gas tanks can be turned in to Suburban Propane, 881 Coldbrook Road, Hermon, ME. You should call for hours and fee schedules at 848-2346.

Empty 20 pound propane tanks (those used for outdoor grills) may be taken to the Brewer Landfill when open, and will have a \$5.00 disposal fee.

Larger tanks have a \$20.00 disposal fee, and smaller tanks will not be accepted at the landfill.
