#### G. New Business.

- 1. Finance Director Karen Fussell gave a brief budget overview of the changes on the orders and resolves presented in this section of the agenda.
- 2. PUBLIC COMMENTS City and School Budgets.

Chairman O'Connell said this was the section of the agenda that anyone who would like to comments on the City and School Budgets may get up and address the Council. He asked that all who spoke please state their name and address.

There were several residents in the audience that asked the City Council to approve a budget for the City and School with the full amount that the School Committee recommended for the schools.

There were also some residents that asked the City Council to approve a budget for the City and School with cuts so that the mil rate would not go up and residents property taxes would not increase.

Chairman O'Connell asked if anyone else wished to speak and seeing none he read some remarks he had prepared:

When you raise your hand for public office, you need to realize the whole scope of what that entails. I've served and experienced 6 School Board budgets -4 years of High School District Trustees budget and this is my 7<sup>th</sup> year working on a City Council budget.

As an elected official, you are constantly going through the good, the bad, and the ugly. I would have to say this budget has been an "ugly" process. Our "community of caring" values have not been observed through this process.

As an example, is how a few special needs kids in a certain housing complex were presented as one of the focal points of what was driving this budget. They are all citizens of the City of Brewer.

Basically, we put these kids out in the front and said you are one of the reasons our budget is what it is. Don't think kids don't talk. Don't think for a minute they are not feeling the heat of these conservations. Bottom line is, they're just kids. They don't deserve this kind of attention.

It's gotten to the point where heated conversations via social media over the right to free speech and the right to open carry firearms are happening. People, we are talking about a budget. A budget that is fiscally responsible to All the Citizens of Brewer. I want to emphasize "All Citizens".

Take a step back – every single month we make payment arrangements with people who are on the verge of losing their homes – that piece of land to call their own. Just last month we mailed out 235 lien notices to people who still owe on their taxes.

All five of us have heard from the business community- some on shoestring budgets. Some who are here only because of the work ethic of our citizens.

As you all know, there are many sides to a budget. It is our job to listen to all of those sides.

Again, the purpose of a budget is to do what is fiscally responsible for all of our citizens. It is not to make new enemies out of old friends.

Brewer is a great City. It's a great place to raise a family and it's a great place to live.

I firmly believe this budget will continue those values.

Thank you.

Councilors Ferris, Uhlenhake, Goss and Vachon commented that this was a tough budget and everyone has worked truly hard. They thanked everyone who spoke and said even though everyone doesn't always agree, we respect what everyone had to say.
