REMARKS OF BEVERLY UHLENHAKE - CITY OF BREWER ANNUAL MEETING 2015

Good evening and thank you for entrusting to be your mayor for the coming year.

Before I begin, I want to congratulate my fellow city councilors Goss and Vachon on their reelection, school committee members Forrest, Smith, and Blanchard on their elections, and Trustee O'Connell on his extremely hard-fought, albeit uncontested, reelection. I also want to thank everyone who ran for office for stepping up and being willing to take on the role of public service for our fellow Brewer residents. More candidates means more conversations throughout our city about how we can make this a better place to live and learn. It can only make us better.

I'd like to welcome the representatives from Bangor and Hampden councils who have joined us, as well as our State Representative Archie Verow.

I also want to take a moment to introduce my family who is with me tonight. My wife, Sue, and our three kiddos, Ben, Ansley, and Quinn. For the superintendent and the school board members here tonight, you should know that our kids each think that their teacher is the best in the entire school. Actually, I think Ben has said that every single year. We're lucky to have such great teachers.

And I have another pair of guests here that you can't see. My parents are joining us via Facetime here on my iPad. Please say hello to Bob and Helen Uhlenhake. Dad and I have always talked about politics a LOT. I know how high his standards for public servants are; I hope I can live up to them!

We've had a very busy year here in Brewer. We've given away 11 Keys to the City, with more on the way. We've celebrated new businesses and businesses that have been around for a very long time. There is a lot of good things to talk about.

That said I'm not going to spend time tonight to discuss Brewer's strengths or its challenges and make promises about how we might fix any issues. Rather, I want to talk about the role of Brewer City Council and how we make decisions. It is my firm belief that if we continue to act with integrity and with a keen eye on the present and future residents of Brewer, we will find the path to the best solutions for the City.

In a few minutes, and indeed, as we have at every annual meeting for a number of years, we shall adopt the 10 Habits of Highly Effective City Councils and the Ethical Principles of Excellence in Government. You'll hear us pledge to think and act strategically, to allocate time and energy appropriately, and to get a valid assessment of the public's concerns. We'll define a true Brewer public servant as one who has the courage of his or her convictions, does not succumb to peer or political pressure, and never forgets that he or she is working for the people – ALL the people.

Rotarians also have a simple test for making decisions that I tend to use. It goes like this: In all things we think, do, or say:

- Is it the truth?
- Is it fair to all concerned?
- Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- Is it beneficial to all concerned?

I propose an additional question for us on Brewer City Council: Will it be beneficial to residents of Brewer today and tomorrow? Because if it doesn't benefit Brewer citizens in some way, we shouldn't be doing it.

In addition to advocating for each of you when you hit the proverbial (and inevitable) pothole, we'll also be doing things you might not see. We'll be working closely with our surrounding communities to improve the region as a whole. We'll be paying attention to state and federal politics that can impact our citizens. And we'll be meeting with our delegations to Augusta and to Washington DC to "advocate up" so they know precisely how their decisions might positively or negatively impact you, their constituents.

While we are paying attention to the big picture, our City Staff will continue to focus on making this the best place to live in Maine. From entertaining and educating our kids in the Rec program and at the library to making our roads safe to ensuring we have clean water to drink to literally putting out the fires, our city staff are to be commended for their dedication to you, our citizens. A few years back when Jerry Goss stood in this position at a time when the city was taking possession of our former schools while also dealing with the foreclosure crisis, he urged the staff to take up the mantra of "fix it or flatten it". While thankfully we don't have to worry now as much about buildings, I'll urge you to continue in the same strain: Make good decisions for the citizens of Brewer, and then simply get it done.

All of us, both staff and council, over the next year will continue to use a very clear lens – one that requires us to ask the question: Will this be beneficial to present and future Brewer citizens?

Over the last two years, I've gotten to know these gentlemen to my right and the city staff, and I know that I can speak for them when I say that we pledge to be here for you, that we will act with integrity, and we will indeed keep a keen eye on the needs of the residents of Brewer of today and tomorrow.

Thank you again. This is a humbling experience. I'm looking forward to a fabulous year ahead.

- will not act out of spite, bias, or favoritism;
- contributes to a climate of mutual trust and respect;
- does not succumb to peer or political pressure;
- refuses to let official action be influenced by personal relationships, including those arising from past or prospective employment;
- has the courage of his or her convictions;
- does not try to shift blame to others;
- never forgets that he or she is working for the people <u>all</u> the people;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the members of the Brewer City Council formally adopt and actively pursue the Ethical Principles for Public Servants provided by the "Council for Excellence in Government," 1992;

- 2. Understand and Demonstrate the Elements of Teams and Teamwork
- 3. Master Small-Group Decision Making
- 4. Clearly Define Roles and Relationships
- 5. Establish and Abide by a Council-Staff Partnership
- 6. Make a Systematic Evaluation of Policy Implementation
- 7. Allocate Council Time and Energy Appropriately
- 8. Set Clear Rules and Procedures for Council Meetings
- 9. Get a Valid Assessment of the Public's Concerns and An Evaluation of the Council's Performance
- 10. Practice Continuous Personal Learning and Development As a Leader
