A. Minutes

B. Awards, Petitions and Public Comments

1. Workshop: Fiscal Year 2026 Budget Workshop.

City of Brewer City Manager Eric Glidden began the workshop by outlining the City's current status within the budget process. The City Manager mentioned upcoming budget meetings of note: the first reading of the School Budget at the Brewer School Committee meeting on April 7; the City of Brewer budget workshop scheduled Tuesday, April 15 at 6:00 p.m.; the second reading of the School Budget at the Brewer School Committee meeting on May 5; the joint City and School public information meeting on the budget scheduled Tuesday, June 3 at 6:00 p.m.; and that the City Council would consider approval of the proposed Fiscal Year 2026 Budget at the meeting scheduled Tuesday, June 10 at 6:00 p.m.

City of Brewer Finance Director Karen Fussell gave an overview of the Fiscal Year 2026 Budget and factors shaping the budget process.

The City Manager discussed highlights and goals for the Fiscal Year 2026 including: tax stabilization; employee retention; creation of a new position in the Technology Department; and increasing assessed values to account for escalating market values and to bring down the mil rate. The City Manager said that the status of federal funding remained uncertain for the upcoming year, but noted that the City had a healthy fund balance.

The Finance Director made a presentation on the School Department Budget for Fiscal Year 2026. Brewer School Superintendent Gregg Palmer and School Business & Finance Director Gretchen Gardner answered questions from the Council regarding the School Budget.

The City Manager made a presentation on state revenue sharing and how revenue sharing is tied to valuation and tax assessment. City Tax Assessor Valerie Moon answered questions for the Council regarding valuation and tax assessment.

The Finance Director made a presentation on the budget for enterprise funds including the Brewer Sewer Department and the Brewer Water Department.

The City Tax Assessor made a presentation on the role of the tax assessor and the valuation process.

TITLE: ORDER, AUTHORIZE PURCHASE OF UTILITY TRACTOR/MOWER FOR WATER DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Brewer Water Department is responsible for maintaining the grounds at the Water Treatment Plant, including mowing, field maintenance, road repair, and spring clean-up; and

WHEREAS, the Water Department also maintains cross-country access routes in the distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the Water Department's current zero-turn mower is eighteen years old, and replacement parts are not available, necessitating modifications to keep the equipment operational; and

WHEREAS, sealed bids were solicited, received and evaluated for the purchase of a new utility tractor/mower, which was included in the Fiscal Year 2025 (FY25) Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget approved by the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, that the Brewer City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to sign a purchase order with Beauregard Equipment for the acquisition of a tractor, loader, and mid-mount mower at a total cost of \$28,890, excluding the bush hog attachment; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that funds for this purchase be charged to account #0571003-573045, titled "Utility Tractor/Mower."; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that funding for this purchase shall come from funds left over after completion of the Robinhood Drive Line Replacement project.

Statement of Fact: The mower at the Water Treatment Plant requires replacement. A utility tractor is recommended as a replacement, providing year-round functionality. The tractor will assist with snow removal, spring sand clean-up, mowing, and field bush hogging for both the distribution system and the plant. Beauregard Equipment was the lowest bidder with qualifying loader specifications. The bush hog attachment will be purchased separately, as the size offered by Beauregard was unsuitable for the tractor, and the cost to upgrade was not competitive with other bids.
