

## 2025 Bikes for Books

Since 2006, Masonic Lodges across Maine have brought over 15,000 bikes to students who participate. Each year over 1 million books are read in Maine from this program. We are hoping to have your support and encouragement to inspire your children want to read more.

The objectives are threefold:

- increase student reading and comprehension skills
- recognize positive student achievements
- provide an attainable goal, with life enhancing results

## It's easy and fun to join this program:

- 1. Take this notice home to your parent/guardian so they can learn about this program and give you written permission to join the fun.
- 2. Agree to read the number of books suggested by the Brewer Public Library for your age group, or talk with the Children's Librarian to find a reading plan that works best for you. Reading suggestions:

**Newborn - Kindergarten 1:** Parents are encouraged to set an amount of time to read with children together each week. Turn in reading log by July21st

**Grades 1 – 5:** Students record titles read weekly on Google sheet, and turn it in at the circulation desk before or on July  $21^{st}$ . Each title counts as an entry into a bike drawing

**Grade 6 - 12** Students record titles read weekly on Google sheet, and turn it in at the circulation desk before or on July 21<sup>st</sup>. Each title counts as an entry into a prize drawing

- 3. Read! You have from June17<sup>th</sup> to July 21<sup>th</sup> to complete your reading.
- Keep track of your reading in your reading log, and return the log to the Brewer Public Library by July 21<sup>st</sup>.
- 5. Attend the end of summer reading party on July 24<sup>th</sup> to see if you are the lucky winner of a free new bicycle and helmet (one bike and helmet will be awarded to a boy and girl in each grade level). About 20 bikes and helmets will be given away to program participants in a random drawing.

6. Continue to read and enjoy riding your bike in a safe and responsible way while wearing your helmet. See attached permission slip and student/teacher reading contract.
