# I-395/Route 9 Connector Officially Opens!



On Friday, June 27, state and local officials gathered to celebrate the long-awaited opening of the I-395/Route 9 Connector. The new roadway, which has been under construction since 2022, creates a direct link between Interstate 395 in Brewer and Route 9 in Eddington, enhancing safety and efficiency for commuters and commercial traffic traveling between eastern Maine and the Canadian Maritimes.

The opening ceremony included remarks from Maine Department of Transportation representatives and local leaders, who highlighted the connector's role in reducing heavy truck traffic through Brewer's residential neighborhoods and downtown streets. Officials also noted the project's significance in supporting regional economic development by improving access to markets and streamlining transportation routes for goods and services.

The connector is now open to traffic, marking the completion of a project that has been in planning and development for more than three decades. Residents and businesses throughout Brewer, Eddington, and surrounding communities are expected to benefit from improved travel times and roadway safety.



# Brewer has a new contractor for curbside collection!



# Beginning Tuesday, July 1, 2025, Gregory's Disposal will be our new curbside collection contractor.

What does this mean for Brewer residents?

# There is no change to the current curbside collection rules.

- Max of 5 bags (weighing less than 40 lbs per bags).
- If you have more than 5 bags out curbside, each additional bag will need a tag which
  can be purchased at the Brewer City Hall, Brewer Public Library or <u>online by clicking</u>
  <a href="https://doi.org/10.1007/j.nch.neb/">here</a>.
- Tags come in a sheet of 5 for \$10.00 (\$2.00 per tag).
- Cardboard does not need to be in a container, as long as it is broken down to '2x2' or smaller and neatly bundled.

# There is no change to the scheduled days of collection.

# Residents may see a difference in the time of day of the collection; therefore,

the City suggests that all residents follow the curbside collection ordinance and have their rubbish set curbside by 7:00am on the day of their collection.

If you live on a private road in Brewer or have a commercial account with Casella, there will be no change for you and Casella will continue to service your residence for curbside collection.

It is the City's goal to make the transition to a new contractor as seamless as possible, but there will likely be an adjustment period and we appreciate your patience during this time.

Should a resident be missed for collection, have a concern or a concern with the new contractor please contact the Brewer Public Works Department as soon as possible at 207-989-7800 between the hours of 7:00am and 3:30pm, Monday through Friday.

The sooner we are alerted to issues, the quicker we can address them and help ensure a smooth transition.

# Brewer City Council Establishes Charter Review Commission

The Brewer City Council has officially established a Charter Review Commission in accordance with 30-A M.R.S. §2103 to conduct a comprehensive review of the City Charter. This initiative aims to ensure that our City Charter reflects the current needs, values, and governance practices of our community.

# **Commission Structure:**

- Nine members will serve on the Charter Review Commission.
- Of the nine members, six members will be elected at-large and without party designation as part of the Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 4, 2025.
- Of the nine members, three must be appointed by the City Council within 30 days after the election.

# **Nomination Petitions Available:**

Nomination petitions for the six Charter Review Commission seats will be available at the City Clerk's Office beginning Tuesday, September 2, 2025. Nomination petitions must be signed by fifty (50) registered City of Brewer voters for candidates to qualify for the ballot. Nomination petitions must be submitted to the City Clerk's Office no later that 4:00 p.m. on Monday, September 22, 2025.

# Timeline:

- The Commission will convene in January 2026.
- Its goal is to complete the Charter review and submit any proposed revisions to voters in advance of the November 2026 election.

# **Public Engagement:**

The City is committed to transparency. The Commission will hold public meetings and hearings in accordance with Maine's Freedom of Access laws and actively seek community input throughout the review process.

# NUTRITION

Serving: 1 Popsicle (This recipe makes a total of 8 popsicles)

Calories: 143 kcal
Carbohydrates: 15g
Protein: 1g
Fat: 10g
Saturated Fat: 8g
Sodium: 61mg
Fiber: 1g
Sugar: 5g

# **INGREDIENTS**

- 4 cups fresh blueberries or frozen blueberries
- 1 (15-oz) can full-fat coconut milk
- ¼ cup pure maple syrup
- 1/8 tsp sea salt



# INSTRUCTIONS

- Place blueberries, coconut milk, pure maple syrup, and salt in a high-speed blender and blend until completely smooth. There may still be little flecks of the outside of the blueberries in the popsicle mixture, but this won't affect the texture.
- Pour the blueberry mixture into the popsicle mold, filling the holes almost all the way up.
  - Insert a wooden popsicle stick into each of the holes and cover the mold with its cover.

    (Sticks are optional depending on size of mold you use)
- Freeze popsicles for 4 to 8 hours, or until they have completely set up.
- When you're ready to eat a popsicle, you can run the outside of one (or more) of the molds under warm water for 30 seconds, or until the popsicle melts just enough to loosen up from the mold. You can also thaw the popsicles at room temperature until they release easily from the mold.

The Brewer Public Library has started its summer hours. This means that the library will be closed on Saturdays from May 31st until September 6th. All other hours will remain the same.


